The purpose of the Selected Topics designation courses is to offer a course only once to respond to a special need, or to offer on a trial basis to determine if there is sufficient student interest to add the course permanently.

A course can only be offered as a Selected Topics three times.

Any faculty member who would like to offer a Selected Topics course must obtain approval of their Department Chair and approval of the Department Curriculum Committee (FMHI Curriculum Committee for CFS, DAHMD, and MHLP) for both the specific topic as well as their own qualifications to teach that selected topic. If the course is to be offered as an elective within a degree, certificate, or other course of study at USF, the Academic Program Coordinator of the relevant program must review the course to determine that it meets the program's objectives and is appropriate for that curriculum.
