Position Description:

The University of South Florida, the Department of Criminology, invites applications for a twelve-month tenured position as Department Chair. The Department of Criminology offers degrees at the Bachelor's, Master's, and Ph.D. levels. To learn more about the department, please visit our web site at: <http://criminology.usf.edu>. The responsibilities of this position include: administration of doctoral, graduate, and undergraduate level courses in Criminology; administer the Department's responsibilities involving Ph.D. student research and dissertation studies; and provide leadership in scholarship, research, grantsmanship, and service.

Salary is commensurate with experience and qualifications. Members of underrepresented groups are encouraged to apply.

Minimum Qualifications: Must possess a Ph.D. in Criminology, Criminal Justice, or a related social science discipline.

Preferred Qualifications: Area of specialization is open. Preference will be given to those who have had an appointment in academic administration, such as chair, associate chair, or graduate program director. Prior experience as a faculty member in a Ph.D.-granting program is also desired. Applicants should also demonstrate (a) a strong record of research productivity, (b) success in securing external funding, (c) commitment to graduate education, and (d) national visibility in the field of criminology. Preference will be given to individuals who can be appointed at rank of Full professor but appointment to a rank of Associate professor will also be considered.

Start Date for Position: The position begins in Fall, 2011.
